****Name and explain one skill you learned from a mentor.**

My mentor, Ed, helped me how to strategically empower others. Through his guidance and by observing him in action, I learned the following key principles of effective delegation: matching the task to the person; providing clear context and objectives; setting clear expectations and deadlines; providing necessary resources and support; empowering and



trusting; and providing constructive feedback.

****Describe your career path to reach your current position.**

It wasn't a straight line, but rather a series of roles that progressively expanded my responsibilities and exposed me to different facets of finance and business operations.

My journey began with a Bachelor's degree in Accounting, providing me with the fundamental principles. Then I pursued Masters degree in Marketing, that provided me some principles on how to bridge between the marketing and finance teams.

Being part of an organization that provides life-changing programs and services to local children and adults with all types of disabilities is incredibly satisfying for me, even though I'm not a clinical provider.

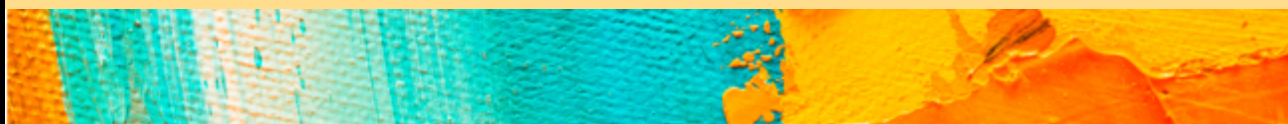
****What does ANEW mean to me?**
