- of the Greek gods. In ancient Greece, only free men who spoke Greek were allowed to compete in the Olympics. Women were not permitted to participate or even watch the games. However, there was a separate festival for women called the Heraean Games.
- Victory Prizes: The prize for winning an event in the ancient Olympics was a simple olive wreath, also known as a "kotinos," made from a sacred olive tree in Olympia. Unlike today's medals, there were no second or third-place awards.
- The Modern Revival: The modern Olympics were revived in 1896 by Pierre de Coubertin. The first modern Games were held in Athens, Greece, and featured 13 countries competing in 43 events.
- 4. The Olympic Flame: The tradition of the Olympic flame began in 1928. The flame is lit in Olympia, Greece, and then carried by relay runners to the host city of the Games. It symbolizes the continuity between the ancient and modern Olympics.
- No Olympic Games in 1940 and 1944: Due to World War II, the 1940 and 1944 Olympics were canceled. The Games resumed in 1948 in London.
